Some Information regarding the excursions on Wed, July 7th 2010:

Since online registration ended, we have added a third excursion. If you have already pre-registered for an excursion and you wish to change your registration, you may do so at the registration desk onsite.

Monastery Klosterneuburg and the scenic Vienna Woods

We will enjoy a tour and also have time to visit independently the impressive buildings of the Klosterneuburg monastic complex that rise majestically on a hill above the banks of the Danube just north of Vienna. Founded in 1114 by Leopold III of the Babenberg dynasty that ruled Austria during the Middle Ages, Klosterneuburg is one of the oldest and richest monasteries in Austria today. Highlights include the impressive priory church, the chapel of 1318 housing Saint Leopold's tomb, a monastic library with more than 30,000 volumes and many manuscripts, and the spectacular Baroque monastic buildings of the 17th and 18th centuries designed by leading architects of the period, including Jakob Prandtauer and J.E. Fischer von Erlach. Of special importance is the Verdun Altar. Made in 1181 by Nicholas of Verdun, the massive altar is comprised of 45 gilded copper plaques modeled on Byzantine designs. After touring the monastery, you will enjoy a walk through the heart of the scenic Vienna Woods (Wienerwald) at the [Naturpark Eichenhain](#).
